## ABSTRACT SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

Read these instructions carefully. The deadline and space requirements are strictly enforced to give all authors an equal opportunity to submit their work in the same amount of space and under the same constraints.

1. Ethics committee approval is required for all experimental (clinical and non-clinical) studies.
2. All TUE clinical audit/service evaluation/quality improvement initiatives should be registered on Infonetica and have received approvals to proceed.
3. Approval is required from a Consultant or head of the department the study was performed before submission of the abstract.
4. Abstracts must not exceed 200 words +/- 10%.
5. All Research, Audit and Quality improvement abstracts should be submitted with on the Irish Medical Journal abstract form.
6. References should not be included.
7. The use of bold print, capital letters and underlines should be minimised.
8. Generic names for drugs and devices should be used.
9. Only standard abbreviations should be used. Non-standard abbreviations should be defined by placing them in parentheses after the first use of the full word or term.
10. Please note that it is the author's responsibility to submit abstracts free of typographical or other errors.
11. Please note in the email with your abstract submission if you would like your submission considered for the following prizes
  - a. JA Brian Keogh Nephrology Research Medal & prize
  - b. Mary O'Connor Research Medal & Travel Bursary in Emergency Nursing prize

- All abstracts will be reviewed by a peer review panel
- Top abstracts will be published in the Meath Foundation's Research Symposium's abstract book on the Irish Medical Journal
