Prof Anne-Marie Brady

Professor of Nursing & Chronic Illness

School of Nursing & Midwifery, Trinity College Dublin

She is a Registered General Nurse with over 30 years of clinical practice, education and research experience in nursing and health care management. Her research work has focused upon the development of health systems and workforce development in healthcare. She has conducted research studies in collaboration with health service providers to examine issues around patient related outcomes measures, self care, workload measurement, practice development, patient safety and competency among health care workers. Her research interests are concerned with the provision of person centred, supportive care and with strategies to meet healthcare demands around chronic illness/cancer survivorship.

Prof Seamas Donnelly,

Professor of Medicine, Tallaght University Hospital and Trinity College Dublin

He leads the Department that provides care for patients with both acute COVID-19 infection and those with the Long-COVID Syndrome. He is an international leader in Translational Medicine and his research epitomizes classical bench to bedside on an international stage. He was recently awarded an Honorary Professorship by the University of Edinburgh for international leadership in Translational Medicine. The work of his research group creates clinical, genetic, biological and sensor datasets which when interrogated generated predictive models guiding therapies in chronic inflammatory diseases.

He is a co-applicant on the Trinity Wellcome Trust/HRB Clinical Research Facility. He is the Trinity Lead-PI on the Dublin-Midlands Health Innovation Hub Ireland based and is responsible for both the assessment of early-development technologies in the healthcare sector and the delivery of a boutique of educational offerings in the healthcare innovation space. He is currently a serving board member of the HRB. He is the President of the Association of Physicians of Great Britain & Ireland. Prof Donnelly is also the current Editor-in-Chief of the Quarterly Journal of Medicine (Oxford University Press), an international medical journal.
